Our objectives

For 2025+, the strategic objectives for the eAccounting and Claims community have been agreed on the following topics:

- Alignment and design support of wider London Market and Lloyd's syndicates with GRLC ACORD Standard/Ruschlikon activities through Blueprint Two – Phase Two
- Enhance receiving capabilities of (re)insurance brokers
- Support the ACORD standard developments through active contribution in eA&C BIG and other design groups to cover topics such as extended party messaging and claim management (e.g co-insurance, inter-company)
- Set out how eMessaging standards can best interact with Artificial Intelligence, to ensure data integrity and guarantee the best results

In addition, the community continues to closely collaborate with the ePlacing group to leverage experiences and push adoption. The post-placement messaging will be expanded to other Ruschlikon partners for testing and implementation and, last but not least, the community is focused on onboarding new Ruschlikon members and increasing message exchange with current members.
